

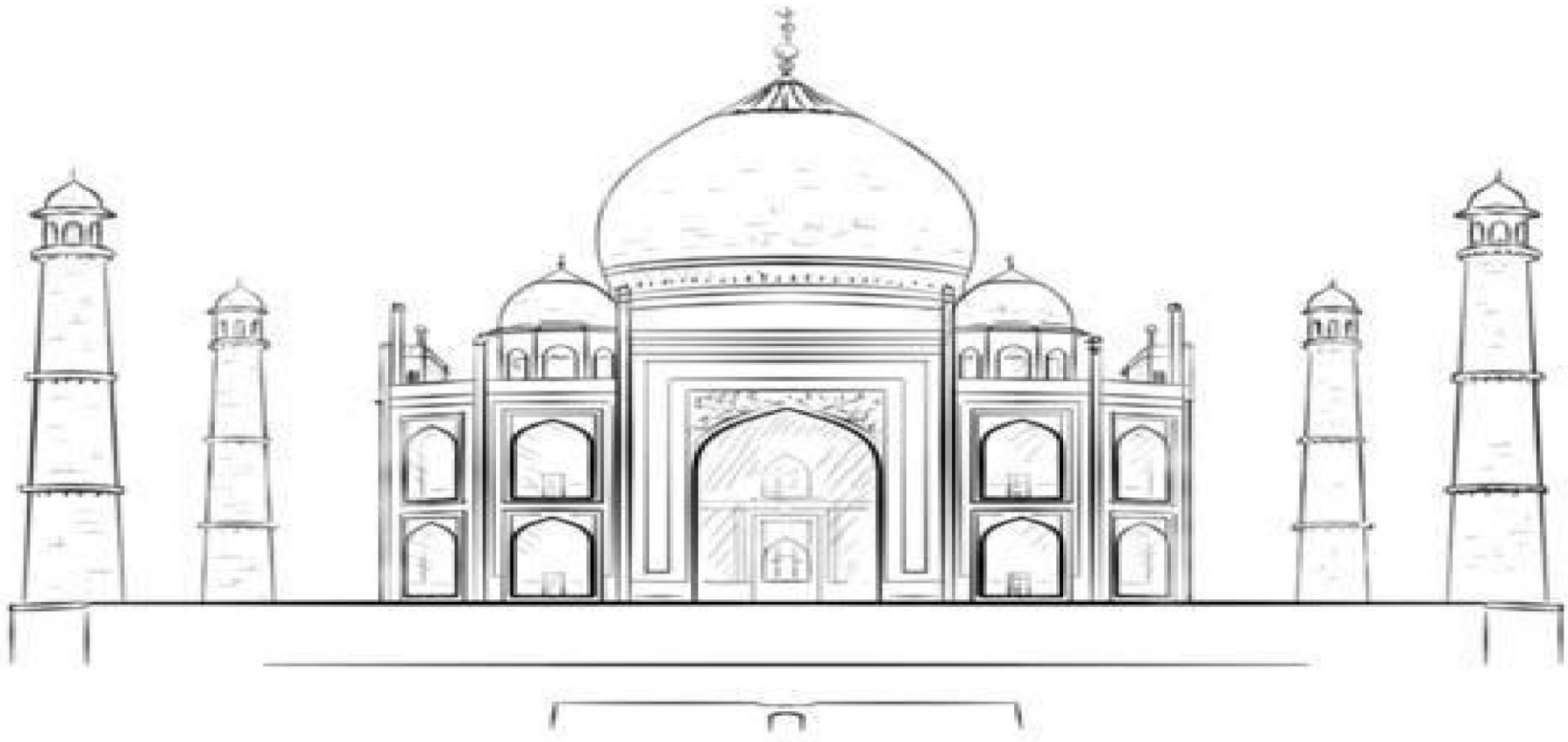
## Colour in the Taj Mahal



This model of the Taj Mahal is in the museum's special exhibition Cabinets of Curiosity.

The real Taj Mahal is an ivory white marble building in the Indian city of Agra. It was commissioned by Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan in 1632 to house the tomb of his favourite wife; it was completed in 1643 but work continued for another ten years. The Taj Mahal is in the centre of a complex that includes formal gardens, a mosque and a guesthouse.
