

Colour in an owl



The Museum has a barn owl on display in the special exhibition Cabinets of Curiosity.

You know a barn owl from its heart-shaped face and pure white underparts. It can be found throughout this country and is nocturnal (active at night). It particularly likes to eat mice, voles, shrews and other small mammals and birds. It can be seen in open country, along fields, riverbanks and roadside verges.

Using felt tips or colouring pencils, add details to and colour in this cartoon owl. Don't forget to name the type (breed) of owl it is! You can look online to find out the different breeds of owls that live in this country – there are five in total!
