

## Colour in a Saxon saucer brooch



The Museum has a selection of Saxon brooches on display in the permanent exhibition, Lives and Landscapes.

This one is a Saxon saucer brooch, so called because of its circular shape. It is made from gilt bronze and has a sun-like motif in the centre; it was discovered in East Shefford. It was worn, usually in pairs, to fasten clothing – this was before buttons, zips and Velcro!

Using felt tip pens or colouring pencils, colour in. If inspired, design your own saucer brooch. Draw a large circle and fill with patterns.
