This is a large clay pot from Egypt and North Africa. It was donated to the Museum by Harold John Edward Peake (1867-1946). He was an archaeologist and former curator of West Berkshire Museum. He was also an author of many historical and archaeological books, and a great collector of antiquities. He was known to travel far and wide, with his wife Charlotte, for his studies.
