Make a 3D sheep

You will need: cardboard roll, pencil, scissors, paint, paintbrush, scrap of thin card (from a cereal box or similar), fine nib permanent marker, felt tip pen (optional).

Instructions:

1. On a cardboard roll, draw a sheep – please see the pictures below which show you the front, back and sides views (left to right).







2. Cut out – please see the picture, below, that shows how the cardboard roll looks after it is cut out.



- 3. Paint the sheep inside and out. Leave to dry.
- 4. On thin card, cut out two small circles (eyes). Add pupils with the permanent marker or a felt tip pen.
- 5. Gently fold the head forwards.
- 6. Glue on the eyes and add details to the sheep with the permanent marker.
- 7. Your sheep is complete! You can imagine its adventures in the fields of West Berkshire.



Fun facts: Newbury and the surrounding area once became rich because of the wool trade. One of the reasons is that it's always been a good area for sheep farming. In fact, one of the largest sheep fairs in the country is still held at East IIsley.
