Colour in an Iron Age coin



The Museum has some Iron Age gold coins on display in the permanent exhibition, Lives and Landscapes, and the special exhibition, Hoards.

This one is from a hoard, which is an archaeological term for a collection of valuable objects (often buried), in this case of Iron Age gold coins (also called staters). This hoard was uncovered in Sulhampstead and includes 8 gold coins (staters). The coins show a stylized horse and a cartwheel. These were high value coins and would not have been used for everyday purchases.
