## Make a pig

You will need: cardboard roll, thin card (from a cereal box or similar), scissors, pencil, fine nub permanent marker (black), glue stick, PVA glue/glue dots or doublesided tape, button, paint, paintbrush.

## Instructions:

- 1. Paint the cardboard roll and, if you wish, the button. Leave to dry.
- 2. On thin card, draw and cut out two ovals (for eyes). Use the permanent marker to draw a pupil on each eye.
- 3. At the top of the cardboard roll, gently press downwards and inwards. Then press the 'points' (on each side) downwards to form the pig's ears.
- 4. Use a glue stick to attach the eyes to the cardboard roll. Leave to dry.
- 5. Use either PVA glue, glue dots or double-sided tape to stick on the button (snout).
- 6. With the permanent marker, you can add details to the pig such as eyebrows and trotters. You can also highlight the snout, if you wish.
- 7. Your pig is ready to take to an Agricultural Show!

## Fun facts: This craft was inspired by the photograph below (left), which shows a pig at the Newbury Agricultural Show, eating Vitovis pig meal, in 1954.

A breed traditional to this area is the Berkshire. It is reputed to be a sweet natured and small-sized animal. Queen Victoria was a big fan of this breed!
