
Colour in a Bellarmine jug



This is a Bellarmine jug, also known as a Bartmann jug, dating from seventeenth century, and is a type of decorated salt-glazed stoneware. The main decoration is of a bearded man. It is suggested that this was modelled on Cardinal Bellarmine, who was an opponent of Protestantism.
