Make a finger puppet parrot



This craft was inspired by the parrot on this cigarette holder in the shape of a pipe.

You will need: cardboard roll, scissors, pencil, thin card (from a cereal box or similar), 1 sheet of coloured thin card or thick paper, felt tip pen (black), paint, paintbrush, glue stick/dots.

Instructions:

- 1. Cut the top of the cardboard roll so it forms a very shallow V at the front. With the section of cardboard roll cut off, trim to make a beak - the top should be longer than the bottom part of the beak, and curl over it.
- 2. Paint the cardboard roll and beak. Leave to dry.
- 3. On the thin card (from a cereal box or similar), draw and cut out two large circles for eye. With the felt tip pen, draw a pupil on each eye.
- 4. On the coloured card, draw three long thin feather shapes (for the tail) and eight short feather shapes (for the two wings). Cut out.
- 5. Around the edges of each feather shape, cut lots of shallow cuts.
- 6. At the top of the three tail feathers, glue them together. Leave to dry.
- 7. With each set of four wing feathers glue them together at the bottom to form a wing. Leave to dry.
- 8. Glue on the eyes and beak onto the cardboard roll. Leave to dry.
- 9. Glue on the tail feathers and wings on the cardboard roll. Leave to dry.
- 10. Your parrot is now ready to take flight! To use as a puppet, insert several fingers into the base of the cardboard roll.



Fun facts: Parrots are very sociable birds and like to flock together. This also protects them from other more predatory birds. They are known for being very vocal; their screeches, squawks and screams can be heard throughout the forest - most live in tropical areas.
