

Join us for a guided tour of Shaw House!


We are delighted to announce that guided tours are now available to pre-book on our public opening days between February and September.

The tour will include a guided view of the rooms through the house and will explore the rich layers of history; from the hidden details to the complexities of the restoration.

There will also be additional information about our 'Dressed for Shaw' costume exhibition which gives an introduction to some of the people that once lived at Shaw House and the changes of fashion through time. There will also be the opportunity to view areas not usually open to the public, followed by a complimentary hot drink in the café.

Exclusive private tours can be accommodated outside of our public open days and standard opening hours, depending on availability. There would be an additional fee for this which can be discussed upon booking.





FOCUS on Treasure Through Time

A history of West Berkshire's Treasure

In 2023, both the new Treasure Act came into force and 11,000 finds had been recorded on the Portable Antiquities Scheme for the whole of Berkshire (all 6 unitary authorities), eight thousand of which came from West Berkshire.

West Berkshire Museum and the Berkshire Finds Liaison Officer are celebrating those landmarks with this exhibition, which will look at the history of treasure as well as displaying some of the fascinating treasure finds that have been recorded.

The Works of Marjorie Heather

An exhibition displaying works in the Museum collection by local artist **Marjorie Heather (1905-1989)**.

Heather was a painter of semi-caricature figure groups in oil and watercolour who was born and lived in Newbury, Berkshire.

As a mature student she attended Ruskin School of Drawing, Oxford, 1945-8, and then at Byam Shaw School of Drawing and Painting, 1948-50 and was a founding member of Newbury Art Group in 1947. For over 30 years her work has been regularly selected for display locally and abroad.

Dressed for Shaw

Discover 400 years of history with this exhibition of replica period costume.

Admire the recognisable ruffs of Elizabethan England, the flamboyant frills of the Georgian gentleman and the weathered wool of the Edwardian era, and understand how those items shaped the history of Shaw House.

The exhibition, at Shaw House, is a wonderful visual display for everyone to enjoy with a trail available for younger visitors. There is also a detailed exhibition guide available from the gift shop.

Dressed for Battle

A fascinating display of English Civil War arms and armour on loan from the Royal Armouries.

On display at Shaw House, this is a rare chance to see examples of what soldiers wore and likely fought with during the Battles of Newbury in 1643 and 1644. The representative selection on display once formed part of the most important surviving English Civil War armours before being purchased by the Royal Armouries Museum in 1985.

Art and Architecture in Ancient Egypt

Ancient Egyptian art is instantly recognisable and a famous characteristic of this enthralling civilisation. This talk by Beth Asbury is an overview of art, tomb, temple, and domestic architecture. Come along to find out more about a statue that influenced Henry Moore and the second largest religious complex in the world.

Beth is West Berkshire Council's Assistant Archaeologist. She has also worked as an assistant to Dr Zahi Hawass at the Ministry of State for Antiquities in Cairo, and at the Pitt Rivers Museum and Ashmolean Museum. She is a committee member of the Thames Valley Ancient Egypt Society (TVAES) and the Council for British Archaeology Wessex Group.

The Historic Ridgeway Project

This talk by Daniel Bashford will look at the evidence for the use of the Ridgeway and the evolution of the surrounding landscape over time. It will examine the evidence such as earthworks, artefacts and below ground archaeology and explore the people who used and lived on the Ridgeway.

The Historic Ridgeway Project is a 3-year project to better understand and improve the management of the exceptional archaeological sites along the Ridgeway. Daniel, who is leading on this project, is a professional archaeologist with over 30 years of experience. He is principally a landscape archaeologist and grew up in the spring-line villages on the north face of the Downs where he still lives.

The Second Battle of Newbury

Join us to commemorate the 380th anniversary of the Second Battle of Newbury at Shaw House, which became an integral part of the Royalists defensive position during the battle in 1644.

Bringing history to life, Dr. Christopher Scott will explore the campaign and battle that saw the Royalist army defending northern Newbury against the combined Parliamentarian forces of Essex, Waller and Manchester.

With self-led audio tours of Shaw House available before the talk along with the opportunity to enjoy a private view of the Dressed for Battle exhibition, displaying 17th century arms and armour on loan from Littlecote House.

Cassandra Brydges, Duchess of Chandos

Wife, Stepmother and Interior Designer

Exploring the role of the 18th century wife and the life of Cassandra Brydges who lived at Shaw House from 1728 - 1735.

Artist, Anne Griffiths will discuss the representation of Cassandra's role, responsibilities and her pastimes. Having married her cousin, the Duke of Chandos, she took on the management of not just Shaw House, but also Canons, one of the finest properties in England of its day. Visitors can also enjoy Anne's exhibition 'A Botanic Dream' looking at 18th century gender roles in the newly discovered science of botany, with displays of beautiful hand stitched linens, collages and wallpapers.

Cloth, Charter and Religious Change

The Newbury area in the Tudor period

This eight week course covers the Tudor cloth industry, with locally produced cloth exported across Europe; religious persecution and upheaval as it affected the Newbury area; surviving buildings from the Tudor period; changes in local government with the grant of Newbury's first charter; and an investigation into the historical sources for the Tudor period, including an opportunity to look at Tudor wills.






Reindeer Round-Up!


